

Having borrowed its name from the charming expanse of land that the hotel overlooks, the Galle Face Hotel is the cradle of a colourful and eventful history, finding its origins in

1864 as a Dutch Villa known as the Galle Face House.

Intended as a meeting place for the gentry of colonial Colombo, the hotel soon gained prominence as a landmark location that encompassed diversified experiences. Be it an indoor or outdoor engagement, the hotel that now continues to stand beside the gentle hush & lull of the Indian Ocean as it brushes against the Western Coast, has remained a cultural center point of curated modernity and hospitality.

Airy and filtered with natural light, the lounge offers a pleasant change of space with its dual mirrored interior design and historic decor.






Grand Ballroom




The Museum
